

EL FUTURO CON *WILL* / *WON'T*

AFFIRMATIVE	NEGATIVE	QUESTIONS
I will play. (Yo jugaré)	I won't watch TV. (Yo no veré la tele)	Will I swim? (¿Yo nadaré?)
You will play.	You won't watch TV.	Will you swim?
He will play.	He won't watch TV.	Will he swim?
She will play.	She won't watch TV.	Will she swim?
It will play.	It won't watch TV.	Will it swim?
We will play.	We won't watch TV.	Will we swim?
You will play.	You won't watch TV.	Will you swim?
They will play.	They won't watch TV.	Will they swim?

- **Will** se usa para anunciar acciones o hechos futuros, para predecir lo que se cree que ocurrirá y para expresar decisiones repentinas que se toman en el momento de hablar y que no estaban planeadas.

En afirmativa se suele contraer con el sujeto (**'ll**) y en negativa con la partícula **not** (**won't**). En interrogativa va delante del sujeto y en las respuestas breves se pone el pronombre personal sujeto + **will** o **won't**.

*Your wishes **will come** true soon.* (Tus deseos se harán realidad pronto.)

***Will** everybody **work** online in the future? Yes, they **will**. / No, they **won't**.*

(¿Todo el mundo trabajará a través de Internet en el futuro? Sí. / No.)

*They'**ll** arrive on Saturday.* (Ellos llegarán el sábado.)

*María **won't** go to the cinema.* (María no irá al cine.)

- Con los tiempos de futuro se suelen usar estas expresiones temporales: **soon** (pronto), **later** (más tarde), **tomorrow** (mañana), **tonight** (esta noche), **next week / year** (la semana / el año que viene), **in an hour** (dentro de una hora), etc. Todas pueden ir al principio o al final de la frase, pero se suelen poner al final.




